Registered Nurse (RN) Mobile Unit

Anishnawbe Health Toronto is a fully accredited community health centre which offers access to health care practitioners from many disciplines including Traditional Healers, Elders and Medicine People. We are recruiting a Registered Nurse (RN) Mobile Unit to join a multidisciplinary mental health team which addresses the social determinants of health.

We have broken ground for our new home of Anishnawbe Health Toronto, an Indigenous Hub in the West Don Lands. We expect to be completed in the spring of 2023. Join our dynamic team and the exciting programs and services offered at AHT and our collective work to support the reclamation of culture and identity.

Duties & Responsibilities:

- The Registered Nurse performs CoVid testing and vaccinating from the Mobile Healing vehicle, to Indigenous adults and youth who are homeless and street-affected; delivery of primary care, screens for STIs and chronic disease; completes triage and supports client for whom transport to Emergency Room has been determined as necessary; performs all duties with demonstrated respect for the culture-based model of the organization which emphasizes traditional teachings, methods and healing approaches
- The Registered Nurse is responsible for initiating primary health care within the scope and standards for practice of the Registered Nurse designation independently and in collaboration with other health care practitioners.

- Collects appropriate health history, and intake assessments for the Mobile Healing Unit
- Provide counseling, education, advocacy, health promotion, treatment advice, internal referrals and follow-up
- Contribute to the development of services and care delivery of the Mobile Healing
- Referrals and supports for substance use and mental health concerns
- Provides clients harm reduction information
- Coordinates with ER regarding transfer of care of those patients determined to be in need of an escalation of urgent care
- Connects clients to primary care provider if they do not have one
- Provide care that reflects an understanding and competent knowledge of health and other issues facing the Aboriginal community such as the effects of the post-colonial and residential school syndromes
- Must be able to work independently and collaboratively in a team environment
- Maintains inventory of all medical supplies and PPE and submits orders for replenishment of PPE and medical supplies to the Coordinator, Mobile Medical Clinic
- Collects basic data on all clients served by the Mobile Healing Unit and prepares documentation
- Assists the multidisciplinary mobile team with the management of prescriptions/clients' follow up as required

Qualifications & Experience:

- Registration with the College of Nurses of Ontario; BSCN or equivalent “or an acceptable equivalent combination of education and experience”
- Required to learn about Aboriginal culture, history, traditions, medicines and healing approaches
- An understanding and competent knowledge of health and other issues facing the Aboriginal community such as the effects of the post-colonial and residential school syndromes
