We are recruiting a Maternal Support position, to join our multidisciplinary team which addresses the social determinants of health.

We have broken ground for our new home of Anishnawbe Health Toronto, an Indigenous Hub in the West Don Lands. We expect to be completed in the spring of 2023. Join our dynamic team and the exciting programs and services offered at AHT and our collective work to support the reclamation of culture and identity.

Duties & Responsibilities

- Developing content for educational workshops to support post and prenatal mothers in the areas of: Traditional cultural understanding of mothering, to enhance infant and mother nutrition and meal planning, promoting informed monitoring of infant care as well as post and prenatal health
- Acts as a resource and advocate for parent(s) with regard to interpreting opportunities concerning family support
- Develops and coordinates a roster of health care, diet, Traditional, craft and educational specialists
- Establishes program priorities and makes ethically sound decisions to ensure safe client centred care

- Facilitates weekly workshops, and coordinates speaker engagement from the roster of specialists, as well as develops program material
- Completes reports and logs
- Promotes the program and provides outreach to new and ongoing clients
- Provides case management concerning income, housing and health care
- Maintains case notes in Electronic Medical Record

Qualifications & Experience:

- MSW with related case management skills or: acceptable equivalent combination, of education and experience
- Facilitation skills and effective communication to small groups and individuals
- An understanding and working knowledge of health and other issues facing the Aboriginal community such as the effects of the post-colonial and residential school syndromes
- Strong collaboration and consultation skills with members of AHT multidisciplinary team
- Intermediate level computer skills and experience with Outlook, Excel, Word, Powerpoint
- Demonstrated respect and knowledge of Traditional Healing and an understanding that Aboriginal culture, traditions, teachings, and ceremony are key to healing for many
- Required to learn about Aboriginal culture, history, traditions, medicines and healing approaches
- Experience working with Aboriginal populations, Aboriginal language skills considered an asset
- An understanding of the social determinants of health and other issues relevant to Aboriginal communities in Toronto
